2015-2016 Iowa Department of Education Open Enrollment applications (district to district)

- Grades 1-12 **DEADLINE:** March 1, 2015
- Incoming Kindergarten deadline: September 1, 2015

2015-2016 In-District Permit Application

This is a request for a student who resides in the Cedar Rapids Community School District (CRCS) to attend another CRCS school that is not in the attendance area where the family resides. Please refer to Procedure 602.4a and check with your building counselor to determine if a permit is allowed or required.

- **January 5, 2015** Permit application and guidelines available from resident school
- **March 1, 2015** **DEADLINE:** Submit application to a students attending building
- **April 2015** Parent/legal guardian will be notified in writing of decision on permit

Johnson Elementary will become a STEAM school starting in 2015-2016. The enrollment procedure for new students asking to attend will be by lottery process that will take place later this spring. No new students will be allowed to permit to Johnson Elementary during the 15-16 school year. All students who are currently enrolled may continue to attend if they so choose. There will be a process for students who are currently attending and do not wish to continue in the STEAM school. These procedures will be explained in detail later this spring.

SUMMER SAFETY

As the weather warms up and summertime approaches, it is important to be reminded of some safety tips. Here are a few ideas to help keep your child or teen or any adult safe this summer:

Water Safety

No one should ever swim alone.

Remain with and watch over children while in or near water.

Don't swim in unsafe water.

Be sure your child learns to swim.

Bikes, Skates, and Skateboards

Be sure your child always wears a helmet that fits.

Wear knee and elbow pads when appropriate

Be sure your child knows your rules about where and when your child may ride or skate.

Teach your child the rules of the road.

Sun Exposure

Insist that your child or teen wears sunscreen and don't forget to reapply yourself, too.

Make sure to have adequate water and fluids for all to prevent dehydration.

Avoid peak sun exposure between the hours of 11AM and 2PM.

Miscellaneous

When in wooded or grassy areas, wear protective clothing or bug sprays to protect against ticks and other insects. Remember to check scalp and clothing after being in these areas.

Iowa state law requires seat belts be worn in the front seat by all passengers and beginning July 1, 2010 Iowa state law will require passengers up to age 18 wear a seat belt or be in a proper restraint seat in the back seat of a vehicle. By law a child under 6 years must be secured in a child restraint seat (a safety seat or booster seat). A child under 1 year **and** less than 20# must be secured in a rear facing child restraint system. Due to possible air bag injuries children should be restrained in the back seat of your vehicle.

Remember: Children learn from example and will imitate both your safe and unsafe habits. Take the time to enjoy the outdoors and play with them!

FUTURE KINDERGARTENERS AND PRESCHOOLERS

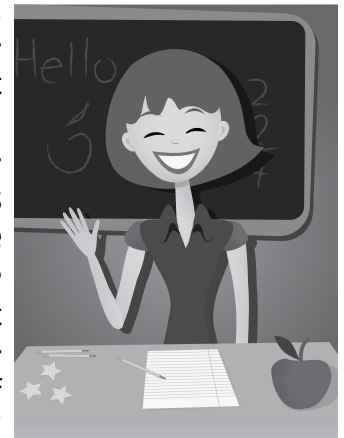

TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

Parents/Guardians in the Cedar Rapids Community School District have the right to learn about the following qualifications of their child's teachers: state licensure requirements for the grade level and content areas taught, the current licensing status of your child's teacher, and baccalaureate/graduate certification/degree. You may also request the qualifications of an instructional paraprofessional who serves your student in a schoolwide Title I program. Parents/Guardians may request this information by calling the Hoover Office.

The Cedar Rapids community School District ensures that parents will be notified in writing if their child has been assigned, or has been taught by a teacher for four or more consecutive weeks who is not considered highly qualified.

MAKING UP WEATHER RELATED HOURS

Beginning Monday, March 30, 2015, classes in the District will begin 10 minutes earlier and will end 10 minutes later. This schedule adjustment will help us make up instructional time that was lost to weather-related delays and cancellations without extending the length of the school year. All District elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as preschool and alternative kindergarten programs will follow the adjusted schedule through the end of the 2014-15 school year.

Beginning March 30, 2015:

Elementary schools will begin the school day at 8:50 a.m. and conclude at 3:55 p.m.

Morning preschool and alternative kindergarten classes will be from 8:30 -11:40 a.m.

Afternoon preschool and alternative kindergarten classes will be from 12:40 – 3:50 p.m.

Middle schools will begin classes at 7:50 a.m. and dismiss at 3:00 p.m.

High school principals will be communicating the updated schedules for their school to families directly.

Students who ride the school bus will be picked up 10 minutes earlier and returned home 10 minutes later.

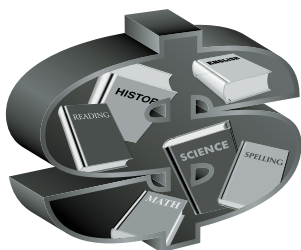
Scheduled District early-dismissal times will not change and will continue to be 12:30 p.m. for middle and high schools and 1:30 p.m. for elementary schools.

SCHOOL FEES REMINDER!

Please pay your consumable material fees. Consumable Fees are due at the beginning of the school year. Consumable fees are \$27.00 per student for the entire year. E-REGISTRATION

PowerSchool is the student information system used by the Cedar Rapids Community Schools. It gives parents the ability to access their child's attendance and stored grades and to email their teacher or teachers anywhere there is internet access. You can update your child's information for your school- new phone numbers, address, health information etc. You can access your parent account you set up last year. Or parents will need to set up their own account using the temporary access id and password which was provided to you if you do not have an account already. We will need every family to update their account as soon as possible this gives us current emergency contact information and permissions for field trips and computer use. Thank you!

STUDENTS THAT ARE SICK OR LATE

When your child is ill, absent or going to be late, please call the clinic at 558-2370. If you are leaving a message please be a detailed message, the time you called and a phone number that you can be reached at if necessary. Students are expected to be in class and to make attendance a top priority. Parents/guardians of the student who will be absent are to notify the school attendance office prior to the absence. If advance notification is not possible, parents/guardians are asked to notify the school office on the day of the absence. If notification is not received, the office attempts to contact the parents/guardians at their emergency number(s). The school determines whether an absence is excused or unexcused. Excused absences include, but are not limited to, illness, family emergency, recognized religious observances and school activities. Unexcused absences include, but are not limited to, tardiness, shopping, hunting, concerts, preparation or participation in parties or other celebrations, and employment.

KINDERGARTEN

The Cedar Rapids Community School District held preschool and kindergarten registration for the 2015-16 school year on Friday, March 6, 2015. Registration took place at the Educational Leadership and Support Center, 2500 Edgewood Road NW.

Children must be three- or four-years-old on or before Sept. 15, to be registered for preschool or five-years-old by Sept. 15, to register for kindergarten.

- Bring the child's birth certificate.
- Proof of family income is needed for preschool registration
- Proof of residence is required for kindergarten.

You can still register your preschooler or kindergartener for next fall. Please stop by the District Offices on Edgewood Road.

LYME DISEASE

Lyme Disease is an infectious disease which is transmitted by the bite of the deer tick. It cannot be transmitted from person to person. The mature deer tick is about 2 millimeters in diameter, about twice the size of a pinhead. They feed by inserting their mouths into the skin of a host and slowly taking in blood. They are most likely to transmit infection after feeding for two or more days. Lyme Disease most commonly occurs during late spring and summer (May through August).

In the United States, the greatest risk areas are the northeastern (New England) states-particularly along the coastal areas, and the western third of Wisconsin. (92% of the cases in 1999 were from these areas.) In eastern Iowa, the risk is low to moderate depending on the area. Individuals who live, work, or play in areas surrounded by tick-infested woods or overgrown brush are at risk of getting Lyme Disease. Hiking, camping, fishing, playing in these areas puts individuals at greater risk for getting the disease.

Signs and symptoms of the disease include a red, slowly expanding, "bull's eye" rash. This occurs within days to weeks following a tick bite, and occurs in 80% of infected people. It may be accompanied by general tiredness, fever, headache, stiff neck, muscle aches, and joint pain. If untreated, arthritis may develop weeks or months later. Lyme Disease is rarely fatal, however, the arthritis symptoms can be long term and unpleasant to deal with.

The best prevention is to reduce your exposure to ticks. Check your clothes and body after being outside, particularly in high risk areas, and removing and disposing of any ticks found. By doing this routinely you should be able to reduce the possibility of contracting this disease, since the tick usually needs to be attached for several days before transmission occurs.

Treatment involves the use of antibiotics, and is usually effective if given early in the disease process. Antibiotics are given for 3-4 weeks. When treatment does not start early, more aggressive antibiotic treatment may be necessary. If you suspect that you or a family member has been exposed to Lyme Disease, contact your doctor to discuss treatment options.

YOUR SCHOOL'S HEALTH OFFICE

In the Cedar Rapids Community Schools we believe that healthy students are better learners. Each school's health office is staffed by a school nurse and a health secretary. The school nurse may care for students in more than one building and will visit each school at least once each week. They may be reached by telephone or e-mail at all times. The health secretary is trained in CPR, First Aid and medication administration and is in the health office every day.

The school should be informed of students' health needs. This information should be added or updated when you e-register your child at the beginning of the school year. Please notify the school nurse or health secretary of any changes to your child's health needs.

Any student who becomes ill while at school should report to the health office. Their temperature may be taken. If the student does not have a fever the health secretary or nurse may have the student rest for 10-15 minutes and then return to class. If the student continues to feel ill parents will then be contacted for permission for the student to go home. You will be called if your child has a temperature that is 100 degrees F. or over, and your child will be sent home. The student may return to school when they are fever free without the use of medicine.

If you have any concerns or questions regarding health issues for your child, do not hesitate to call your school's health office.



METRO CARE CONNECTION

The Cedar Rapids School District is lucky to have four “Metro Care Connection” (MCC) health clinics. They offer free health care to all Cedar Rapids students who do not have access to affordable medical care. Each clinic is staffed by a Children’s Nurse Practitioner.

Our clinics provide:

- Physical exams and immunizations
- Treatment of minor illness
- Basic laboratory tests
- Prescriptions for medications
- Health education and counseling
- Referral for complex medical conditions

Included in these services are school-based mental health counseling and substance abuse counseling. These services are confidential and are also offered at no cost to the student and their family. Contact your school’s health office if you would like to know more about MCC and what they do.

If you have any concerns or questions regarding a health issue or if you need assistance finding a health care provider, please call your school’s health office.



HY-VEE CASH FOR STUDENTS

Please remember to bring in your Hy-Vee receipts. This is a very easy way to raise money for your student’s school. For every \$200 in receipts, Hoover receives a \$1. No receipt is too small, all the amounts add up in the end. Please remind family and friends to save their receipts. We have a bin in the front foyer for you to deposit receipts in (right next to the main office door). Hy-Vee receipts for this school year ends April 1st. Receipts collected after that day will go towards next year’s collection total. Keep saving your receipts. Hoover really appreciates it!!!
